



Republic Day - Republic Day was celebrated by the entire staff and students with flag hoisting followed by a short cultural programme comprising of patriotic songs.










Birth Anniversary Celebrations of Mahatma Gandhi and Lal Bahadur Shastri



Academic Year – 2022-2023


